## School Improvement

Over the course of this year the Stanley County School District has embarked upon a comprehensive school improvement effort.

Last year the District began the AdvancEd process, which is an accreditation process that uses student-focused evaluation and intensive collaboration to improve the way our school provides education.

This fall the District contracted with an outside agency, Teachwell, to conduct a comprehensive needs assessment. This will provide the foundation for a comprehensive four-year plan to address areas that need improvement.

Both the AdvancEd and the needs assessment processes are based on data and what it tells us about the curriculum that we use, the way we are teaching that curriculum, the facilities and technology that support our teaching, and the climate and culture surrounding our efforts to provide education. By the end of the school year the District will be positioned to move forward in a more meaningful way to provide an effective education to our students.

We will be keeping track of minutes on the wall in the elementary building.

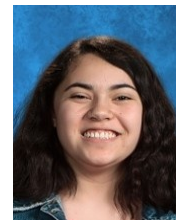
## New Inductees to National Honor Society

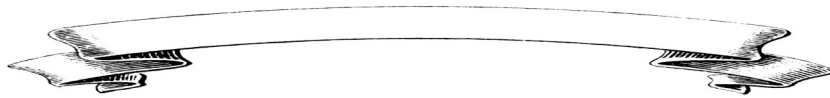
